Two Stimulus Packages

CRRSA - Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act

Passed in late December 2020

ARPA - American Rescue Plan Act

Passed in March 2021

Both for expenses starting in March of 2020 ...



Timeline

CRRSA

- Passed December 27, 2020
- Application due June 15, 2021
- funding for March 13, 2020 September 30, 2023

ARPA

- Passed March 11,2021
- 3 Separate applications due: 5/24/2021, 8/31/2021, 11/30/2021,
- funding March 13, 2020 September 30, 2024



Funding

- Funded through the FEDERAL fund
 - Not part of general fund budget
- Similar process to other grants
 - Application process
 - Spend first then submit for reimbursement

GEER - Governor's Emergency Education Relief: \$95,364

GEER Allowable Uses

- To support specific student populations (special education, career & tech, homeless, native hawaiian, alaska native)
- Child care and early childhood education
- Social and emotional support
- Protection of education related jobs
- Educational services to students
- Support the ongoing functionality of the local educational agency



ESSER Allowable Uses

- To support specific student populations (special ed, career & tech, homeless, native hawaiian, alaska native)
- Efforts to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus
- Address unique needs of low-income, disabled, English learning, minority, homeless, & foster students
- Developing/implementing procedures & systems to improve the preparedness and response efforts
- Training & professional development on sanitation and minimizing the spread of infectious diseases
- Purchase supplies to sanitize and clean facilities
- Planning for and coordinating during long term closures (meals, technology, SPED services, other educational services)
- Educational technology
- Mental health services and supports
- Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and afterschool programming
- Addressing learning loss
- School facility repairs and improvements to reduce risk of virus transmission
- Improving indoor air quality in school facilities
- Developing strategies and implementing public health protocols in line with CDC guidance
- Other activities to maintain continuity of services

5% Reserves: \$499,996

1% Summer Programming: \$100,002

1% Afterschool Programming: \$100,002



90% Allowable Uses

- Minimum 20% to address learning loss
 - Summer programs, extended day, afterschool programs, etc.
 - Respond to academic, social, and emotional needs
- Address needs of specific student groups
 - Low income, students with disabilities, English language learners, racial & ethnic minorities, students experiencing homelessness, foster care youth, etc.
- PPE, Cleaning supplies & Equipment
- Educational technology
- Mental Health Services & Supports

Spending Plan

- Increased teachers to support targeted instruction K-6 & reduce class sizes
- Increased student supports
 - Programming
 - Staffing SPED, Academic Support, Mental Health
- Educational technology needs



5% Allowable Uses

- Address the academic impact of lost instructional time by supporting the implementation of evidence-based interventions
 - Academic needs
 - Social emotional/mental health needs
 - Support students disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 pandemic

- Reading & Literacy programs/curriculum
- SEL programming at ES
- Additional teachers to support targeted instruction



1% Allowable Uses

SUMMER PROGRAMMING - evidence based summer enrichment programs

AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMMING - evidence based comprehensive afterschool programs

Address academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of students



1% Spending Plan

SUMMER PROGRAM

- STEM Camp Grades 1 6
- 3 weeks each summer 2021, 2022, 2023
- For students with academic needs

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

- Tutoring K-12
- Year round
- For identified students with academic or social/emotional needs
